

A WORD FROM THE CHAIR

The National Historical Commission of the Philippines (NHCP) ends the year 2017 with accomplishments in line with its mandate and commitment to promote Philippine history and preserve heritage structures, relics and memorabilia. At the forefront of these projects, with the executive offices at the helm and the Finance and Administrative Division (FAD) providing support, were the four divisions of the Commission namely: the Research, Publication and Heraldry Division (RPHD); the Historic Sites and Education Division (HSED); the Material Research and Conservation Division (MRCD); and the Historic Preservation Division (HPD).

The big part of the Commission's projects in 2017 was the restoration of colonial structures – churches, convents and a watchtower – in Bohol and Cebu that the earthquake in 2013 destroyed. The restoration architects and engineers from the HPD painstakingly restored the colonial structures, while conservators from the MRCD restored the artworks and movable objects





such as paintings, wooden polychromes and pipe organs, among others. The structures that were restored and turned over to the parishes are the following: Dauis Church, Loay Church and Inabanga Church, all in Bohol Province; and the Church of Anini-y, Antique. Other structures that were also restored and turned are the Spanish period Molino Dam in Las Pinas City and the American period Gabaldon school building in Bangued, Abra. As one gazes at these stone structures that are now beautifully standing in the town centers, one cannot help to appreciate the workmanship, resilience and aspirations of the many nameless and faceless Filipino artisans who built them under difficult circumstances during the Spanish and American periods. These buildings also speak of the cultural and religious influences of the Spanish colonizers and the public education legacy of the Americans. While the technical experts of the Commission worked hand in hand on the heritage structures, movable and immovable objects, personnel of the RPHD and HSED worked together in the promotion of history through the conduct

of commemorative lectures, teacher trainings, local and international conferences, publication of historical studies, production of documentaries of revolutionary heroes and installation of historical markers. Two new museums were added to the NHCP museums under the HSED. These were the Jesse Robredo Museum in Naga City and the Museo ng Kasaysayan and Pamanang Boholano in Loay, Bohol. The Commission also unveiled two monuments that represent yet another dark periods of our history as a nation – the Second World War and the Martial Law Period. The Besang Pass Monument is a reminder of the heroism of the Filipino soldiers that led to the surrender of General Tomoyuki Yamashita and end of the Japanese occupation of the country in 1945. The Jose W. Diokno monument, on the other hand, was unveiled in honor of the statesman who fought against the dictatorship of President Ferdinand E. Marcos and became the first human rights commissioner soon after the EDSA Revolution in 1986.

In addition to these were the reprints of three titles: Journal of Philippine Local History and Heritage, Vol. 1, Nos. 1 and 2 and Hidden Lives, Concealed Narratives: A History of Leprosy in the Philippines.


Through the annual observance of Araw ng Kagitingan (April 9), National Flag Day (May 28), Independence Day (June 12), National Heroes Day (August 27), Bonifacio Day (November 30) and Rizal Day (December 30), the nation is continually reminded of the heroism and lessons imparted by our revolutionary heroes whose sacrifices that cost their lives gained our freedom from Spanish and American colonialism, and from the Japanese during the Second World War.

In the midst of the gargantuan task of the Commission is the need for continuing education for its technical experts and researchers. With this, several personnel from the HPD and MRCD went on technical trainings abroad and some researchers from the RPHD and HSED have presented their studies in local and international conferences. These trainings of personnel greatly help the Commission in fulfilling its mandate at par with international standards.











PROJECTS TURNED OVER

The bulk of the NHCP budget in 2017 went to the restoration and conservation of heritage structures all over the country, from Batanes to Sulu. 2017 marked the turnover of most of the restored structures in Bohol and Cebu which were damaged or destroyed by the 2013 earthquake. The harvest of completed projects included restored religious structures, church paintings, retablos and pipe organs. The pipe organ at the St. Michael Parish in Argao, Cebu, which has not been played for the last 60 years, was the featured performer of an evening concert last December 9. The paintings of the four evangelists at the ceiling of the Loay Church dome were painstakingly restored to reveal their glorious appearances. Heritage structures were restored and conserved, in consultation with various stakeholders, and monuments to honor heroes were fabricated, in pursuit of the NHCP's mandate to promote, preserve, and disseminate information on Philippine historical events, places, and personages.

The following projects were turned over to their owners, either Diocese, local government units, national agencies, or state institutions, in 2017.

Most of the restored structures which the NHCP turned over were churches made of coral stones. This material is hinted in the 2017 Annual Report cover and inside pages.


