

A Word from the Chair

The National Historical Commission of the Philippines (NHCP) is proud to present its annual report for 2021. For almost two full years into the pandemic, the Commission was able to bring its mandates closer to the public and the world, thanks to the gift of technology.

Beyond this organizational feat, 2021 also marked the 34 Quincentennial Commemorations in the Philippines (QCP) (16 March-28 October 2021), with the 500th anniversary of the Victory at Mactan transpiring on 27 April 2021, the D-Day. As the home of the National Quincentennial Committee (NQC) Secretariat, the NHCP conducted its various regular programs and functions in complement to the commemorations. Among these were the construction of the Quincentennial Historical Markers, various commemorations especially in the Visayas, Palawan, and Mindanao, and the conservation of historic sites associated with the first circumnavigation of the world. The commemorations were especially memorable as there were times our staff had to extend their stay in the Visayas and Mindanao for almost a month to assist in the preparations. We are also grateful for the gargantuan support of various agencies, local government units, private institutions, and academic bodies in the absence of the NHCP physically in the localities.

The difficulties and limitations brought by the pandemic became a silver lining, allowing us to explore—and eventually embrace—alternative and virtual means of delivering our mandates. In unveiling the historical markers identified along the Magellan-Elcano route, the quarantine restrictions forced us to conduct localized unveiling ceremonies. This allowed us to reinforce our cooperation and communications with our partner local government units. In delivering a wider reach despite limited physical audiences, we strengthened our partnership with the Philippine Communications Operations Office and other government instrumentalities to stream our events. And in continuing the information dissemination for the awareness of the quincentennial commemorations, we turned lectures into webinars, viewed synchronously or asynchronously on the NQC Facebook page and website.

The NHCP also succeeded in convening the three major national professional historical societies, and various history departments from Baguio down to Iligan in the two-month Philippine International Quincentennial Conference. This was so far the biggest history conference participated in by 100 scholars and thousands of participants in webinar rooms, not including the over a hundred thousand participants reached at more than 80 Facebooks pages.

The NQC Secretariat, who were trained by the Radio-Television Malacañang on the Open Broadcaster Software (OBS) in 2020, and echoed the training with the NHCP, assisted in streaming a number of webinars by various local and national historical societies, higher education institutions, and foreign service posts. The same "virtualization" strategy was employed when we aired the inaugural show of the newly restored Metropolitan Theatre, titled Lapulapu: Ang Datu ng Mactan, via Facebook on 24 October 2021 at 6:00 p.m. The streaming garnered around 13,000 real-time viewers versus the 900-total seating capacity of the theatre. Before it was hosted down at 10:00 a.m., the show had 300,000 views.

This is what we precisely mean by converging the past and the future. While the pandemic brought disruptions to the ways we were accustomed to, it was necessary to adapt and adjust for the continuous delivery of services. And we are proud to say that the NHCP has been handling this transition well.

Although we highlight the accomplishments of quincentennial commemorations in this annual report, the succeeding chapters exhibit more of the Commission's mandates.

In 2021, we completed the restoration of the Sta. Maria Church in Ilocos Sur, a declared UNESCO World Heritage Site, and the Bacon Church in Sorsogon City. The Historic Preservation Division also completed the rehabilitation of eight shrines and landmarks under the administration of the NHCP. Meanwhile, the Materials Research Conservation Division undertook the major restoration of three monuments, mostly related to the quincentennial commemorations.

Shifting well toward the virtualization initiative, the Historic Sites and Education Division sustained historical promotion and appreciation activities by implementing webinars and online exhibits. We have included some of these activities and their respective QR codes in this report for you to access. The Division likewise conducted its traditional commemorative programs and unveiling of historical markers.

Through the efforts of the Research, Publication, and Heraldry Division, the Commission was able to print four issues of the *Journal of Philippine Local History and Heritage* and six new titles—a valuable contribution to historical


research in the country.





ANTONIO PIGAFETTA MONUMENT

Fort San Pedro, Plaza Independencia, Cebu City



The 'Pigafetta Monument,' erected in 1980 by the Philippine-Italian Association in memory of Magellan's chronicler, Antonio Pigafetta, and located within the vicinity of the wall of Fort San Pedro in Cebu. Sculpted by National Artist Abdulmari Imao, this significant monument is made of bronze and mounted on a marble pedestal. It was restored to befit the people who chronicled the voyage in 1521 and subsequently became the first to circumnavigate the world.

FERDINAND MAGELLAN'S MEMORIAL MONUMENT

Liberty Shrine, Lapu-Lapu City





'Magellan Memorial' erected in 1866 by Don Miguel Creus in memory of Ferdinand Magellan, commander of the Spanish fleet who reached the Philippines in 1521 and was slain during the Battle of Mactan. This four-tiered monument was made with coralline stone and traditional masonry and decorated with funerary symbols and plaques to honor Magellan. It underwent cleaning and stabilization for the culminating program of the Quincentennial celebration.



PHILIPPINE INTERNATIONAL QUINCENTENNIAL CONFERENCE (PIQC)

The NHCP and DFA also succeeded in convening for the first time the three major national professional historical societies of the country and various history departments from Baguio down to Iligan in the two-month long Philippine International Quincentennial Conference (20 October - 17 December 2021). This was so far the longest and biggest Philippine history conference participated by 100 scholars around the world and 5,938 participants in webinar rooms, notwithstanding the 875,266 online views in 141 Facebooks pages. Streamed and produced by the RTVM, the opening ceremony was symbolically held at the Emilio Aguinaldo Shrine, Kawit, Cavite, the site of the proclamation of Philippine independence on 12 June 1898. This was to assert the Filipino viewpoint of the quincentennial espoused since 2018, for it was in the said occasion the founders of the Filipino nation began viewing the events in 1521 from our own lens.

Established on 25 April 1765 – Sta. Maria church in Ilocos Sur was designated as a UNESCO World Heritage Site on 11 December 1993, as part of the Baroque Churches of the Philippines.

In 2021 the NHCP gave priority to the restoration of the church and bell tower's stone wall, repair and rehabilitation of roofing and ceiling, rehabilitation and retrofitting of doors and windows, comprehensive termite treatment, and painting works.

MUSEO NI EMILIO AGUINALDO

Completed on 21 April 2021, the Periodic Maintenance and Restoration of the museum covers the carpentry works at the E-Learning building, repainting works on the rehabilitated decorative parapet of the roofing, rehabilitation of outdoor public comfort rooms, repair and replacement of deteriorated roof sheets, painting, and waterproofing works.

MUSEO NG KASAYSAYANG PANLIPUNAN NG PILIPINAS

Periodic maintenance and restoration work included the carpentry and retrofitting work on doors, windows, roof fascia boards, decorative moldings, eaves ceiling, and exterior facial board; rehabilitation works on mansion tower, general repainting of exterior walls, grills, and roof sheets of the main building, and comprehensive anti-termite treatment. Rehabilitation of comfort rooms at the main house, souvenir, and guardhouse was also done. The project was completed on 18 July 2021.





For the main museum building, the works covered the rehabilitation of the roofing system, provision of tempered glass roof at the balcony, replacement of termite-infested capiz windows and eaves ceiling, replacement of damaged ceiling sheets at the curator's office, and other areas in disrepair (on the ground floor), re-plastering of cracked/damaged columns and masonry wall, and general repainting and waterproofing work. Maintenance works at the annex building included the repair and replacement of fittings in washrooms, repainting of exterior walls, and replacement of the damaged pavement.
